
MINISTRIES



The mission of the School Sisters of Notre Dame (SSND) is to proclaim the good news, directing their lives toward that oneness for which Jesus Christ was sent.



The SSND were founded October 24, 1833, when Carolina Gerhardinger and two other women began a common religious life in the state of Bavaria, Germany. In 1847, SSND responded to a call to teach children of German immigrants in North America.





Sisters in the Central Pacific Province (CP) are part of an international community of women religious. SSND continue the sacred work of their foundress, Blessed Theresa of Jesus Gerhardinger, to make Christ visible by sharing love, faith and hope, with special emphasis on women, young people and those who are poor. CP sisters live and minister in 47 dioceses, 22 states, Ghana, Guam, Italy, Japan and Kenya.





Sisters live their mission through ministries, prayer and presence serving individuals in traditional schools, non-traditional education environments, hospitals, prisons, nursing homes, parishes and organizations addressing social issues.

SOCIAL JUSTICE



Social justice and advocacy are central to the SSND. Through Shalom, sisters engage in ministry, campaigns, events and activism. In 2021, SSND became a Laudato Si congregation, committing to a seven-year journey toward an integral ecology.
