Sister Barbara Brumleve, SSND

Sister Barbara devoted the first decade of ministry to classroom teaching and furthering her studies. Teaching assignments took her to St. Bernadette in St. Louis and Mater Dei High School in Breese, Illinois. In 1968, she joined the staff of the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis, spending five years as a professor, followed by four years as president. Sister Barbara served in administration at Althoff High School in Belleville, Illinois, from 1978-1981. Following a three-year post as a researcher in congregational history, she moved to Baltimore, serving as a professor at the College of Notre Dame through 1988. In the next era of her ministry, she spent several years in St. Louis as a provincial councilor and director of Maria Center. After one year in campus ministry at the University of Mississippi, Sister Barbara undertook a new educational ministry in health care, devoting the next 20 years to pastoral care and clinical pastoral education in hospitals in South Carolina, Georgia, Nebraska, Missouri, and Indiana. From 2013-2017, she served as manager of the clinical pastoral education program at St. Vincent Hospital in *Indianapolis.* Last year, she moved to the Baltimore area, where she currently serves as coordinator of mission integration at Notre Dame



Preparatory School. Sister Barbara holds a bachelor's degree in English from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis. She later earned both a master's and doctoral degree in English from St. Louis University, a Master of Divinity equivalent, and did post-graduate work to qualify as an ACPE Certified Educator.
