

Sister Rosemarie Nassif, SSND, Ph.D.

Executive Director, Center for Catholic Education Loyola Marymount University School of Education Los Angeles



Sister Rosemarie Nassif, SSND, Ph.D., is the Executive Director of the Center for Catholic Education at Loyola Marymount University School of Education in Los Angeles. Previously, she worked at the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation serving as Program Director for the Catholic sisters and Catholic schools priority areas from 2012 to 2017, during which time she led the granting of \$90 million to Catholic Sisters in 23 countries and \$25 million to Catholic schools in the U.S.

From 2009-2012 she served as senior advisor to the Assistant Secretary at the Department of Education where she had lead responsibility for achieving President Obama's 2020 College Completion goal. She was president of two universities, Notre Dame of Maryland in Baltimore and Holy Names University in Oakland. She has had professional experiences in Japan, Honduras, China, Rome, Korea, London, Italy, and Israel as well as in six countries in Africa.

Catholic Housing Initiative is honored to present our President, Sister Mary Anne Owens, SSND, as our

nominee for the 2023 Women's Leadership Luncheon.

Service, dedication, and a strong commitment to help the most vulnerable have been Sr. Mary Anne's hallmarks. Born in the magical city of New York City, she grew up in an Irish, Catholic home where an education and a strong faith and love for God were the greatest gifts her parents gave to her.

Sr. Mary Anne's leadership has impacted the families of Long Island, New York, through her work with Catholic Charities. She helped the children and families of the Love Field area as the Principal of Our Lady of Perpetual Help as well as the community of Lafayette, Louisiana, by inaugurating the Justice and Peace office for the Diocese and organizing workshops around racism. She also assisted the families of East Dallas as the Director of the Brady Center and eventually led the Catholic Charities of Dallas, which is a social service agency focused on improving the quality of life for the most vulnerable. As a School Sister of Notre Dame, she served on their provincial council when she and her team orchestrated the historical move of combining four provinces based in Milwaukee, St. Louis, Dallas, and Mankato, as well as the Region of Japan, into one province, the Central Pacific Province.

Today, she sits as the President of Catholic Housing Initiative, a community-based non-profit with a mission of providing quality, affordable housing serving thousands of people in the Dallas area.

Sister's leadership has impacted communities around the globe! She is an example of servant leadership.

Postscript: When Sr. Mary Anne was asked to review the application before submission she remarked that she didn't recognize herself, just like a good Irishwoman.




Notre Dame School of Dallas
